Incorporating Texture in Watermedia Paintings

This class will focus on the use of texture in Watermedia painting using textured gel mediums, fabrics and papers for beginner and intermediate levels. Fabric, handmade papers, textured gels and watercolor paper will be supplied. Students are encouraged to bring additional items to incorporate into their paintings, e.g., twigs, string, cardboard, sandpaper, wire, etc. Your wastepaper basket is a good source for these items.

Day 1: Use of textured mediums, fabrics and papers will be demonstrated. Students will try these techniques on watercolor paper and canvas board.

Day 2: A discussion about composition will be followed by painting our samples from Day 1. Next we will combine two or more techniques from Day 1 incorporating them into one piece.

Day 3: Students will learn how to surface-enhance their samples from Day 1 and paint their combined piece from Day 2.
